element of definition, a lacquered goatskin table. The soft and billowy fabric of the bed dressing was manufactured in Europe using vibrant colors seen in sunrises and sunsets. Along with the prevailing Mediterranean theme, there is a distinct air of tropical island accentuated by the wide-blade plantation shutters and a profusion of tropical greenery outside. For an impromptu midnight swim on a moonlit night, steps outside the sliding glass doors lead directly to the swimming pool. The master bathroom was designed to afford as much outdoor view as possible. Custom marble-topped cabinetry includes his-and-hers vanities with arched light compartments above. Windows were strategically placed so the owners can see the ocean

from anywhere in the room, even when they are looking in the mirror. There is a delightful feeling of being surrounded by water and greenery. A door leads directly from the bathroom to an outdoor, bougainvillea-filled whirlpool spa area. Slightly elevated, the spa area overlooks the ocean while remaining very private. An important design consideration was to include accommodations for the owners' visiting children, grandchildren, and guests. The family is large and enjoys being together; however, there are times when the owners are here alone, so the architect designed the home to enable the owners to close off an entire wing containing three guest rooms and baths when the family is not here. This wing is off the upper level of
