accents of blue. These colors are repeated throughout the home as is the botanical motif. Flooring here and throughout the living areas is a cross-cut travertine. Sometimes referred to as saturnia stone, it is in a honed rather than polished finish. Open to the living room is the dining room. Here, too, the views are resplendent. The custom-sized dining table is approximately 12-feet long. Its shape is a race track oval and it very comfortably seats ten. Made of burlled elm, it carries some distressing but not heavily so. Side and arm chairs are in a finish to match the table. Adding a tropical yet elegant touch is the seat

back fabric which features a large, stately palm tree against a truffle-colored background. An 18-candle, brass chandelier with a patina finish provides soft illumination for the setting. The kitchen is located alongside the living and dining rooms but is not open to them. An arch-shaped window with arched wood shutters provides a convenient pass-through between the living areas and kitchen. Granite-topped cabinetry in the kitchen is cherry with a cinnamon stain. The large granite-topped island is in a contrasting color of maple-butter cream with a brown glaze. The backsplash is a 4" x 4" tumbled *crema marfil*
